

Current Status of Fiber Optic Communication in Guinea



Overview

Guinea has moved to add a second submarine fiber-optic cable after signing a construction and maintenance contract, as the country's existing international link nears saturation and the government pushes to expand connectivity capacity under its wider digital economy agenda. The upgrade aims to improve internet service quality for Guineans. The announcement was made by Prime Minister Amadou Oury. Guinea Conakry, with its geographical challenges and rapid growth, aims to become a regional hub for connectivity in West Africa. To achieve this, the country has launched the tailor-made deployment of optical fiber networks.

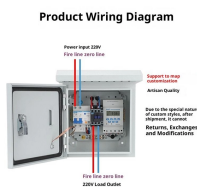
